And finally

This week we celebrate Ascension Day – a much overlooked Feast Day, in my opinion! This was the end of Jesus' appearances on earth and his physical, historical ministry. Jesus' work on earth was done – he had completed the task which God had given him. It was time for him to be lifted up, exalted, glorified – to go back to that position that he had originally occupied alongside his Father in heaven. Before Jesus came to earth, he was one with God and now, having taken on our human nature, we see him being restored to his original place of honour and glory and – through that – restoring **our** relationship with God. And that is why Ascension Day is so important. The birth, crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus would mean nothing if he hadn't returned to heaven to restore that relationship. He would have been restricted to just one time and place. And if Jesus lives in us, we too are carried into the heart of God because of his Ascension.

The collect for Ascension Day: "Risen Christ, you have raised our human nature to the throne of heaven: help us to seek and serve you, that we may join you at the Father's side, where you reign with the Spirit in glory, now and for ever. Amen"
