And finally

This week saw the celebration of the Festival of Bartholomew, the Apostle. He is probably the same person as Nathanael, who is usually associated with Philip. There are only four mentions of him in the New Testament. Traditionally, Bartholomew served as a missionary in Ethiopia, Mesopotamia, Parthia (in Iran) and Lycaonia (in Turkey) and Armenia. This is his collect: "Almighty and everlasting God, who gave to your apostle Bartholomew grace truly to believe and to preach your word: grant that your Church may love that word which he believed and may faithfully preach and receive the same; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen."
