I have just come home from a few days in the Fens (about 50m into Norfolk from Cambridge!). I must say I wasn't very inspired by the landscape – huge empty fields (but very rich and fertile), miles of dykes, drains and rivers that run in parallel lines several meters above the roads (home to a great variety of birdlife) and the once-grand Georgian architecture of Wisbech is now a bit drab. However, Ely was fascinating and full of history. We managed a walk in Thetford Forest and along the Norfolk coast. So the batteries are recharged!

Before I went away, the Parish Safeguarding Officers and I had a meeting. We reminded ourselves that safeguarding is the responsibility of every single person who comes to church and we must do as much as we can to ensure that it is embedded in our ethos as Christians. Although we are very good at providing the tangible evidence that we are taking it seriously: the policies and procedures, roles and responsibilities and safer recruitment practices etc, we need to pay more attention to cultivating healthy attitudes and how we behave towards each other. Safeguarding isn't just about physical or sexual abuse; it is about emotional, spiritual, psychological, financial, domestic and organisational abuse, discrimination and neglect. And it's not just about children but also any adults who are at risk of harm. Would you be able to recognise the signs if someone you know was being abused and would you know what to do about it? If you can't answer "yes" to those two questions, please have a look at our website (and consider doing the training). And please don't say "it won't happen here" – because it definitely could (and has)!

I also had a Fosse Foodbank meeting. And I am pleased to say that despite the number of clients increasing, so is people's generosity – so that supply is still meeting demand. So a big thank you to our supporters.
