News and Views

We are now heading into the season of Lent. It's a six week period of preparation to celebrate Easter. It's an opportunity to examine our lives, to have a spiritual spring clean and to draw close to God through prayer, fasting, reading and the study of the Scriptures. In the words of the prophet Joel, it is a time "to return to the Lord with our whole heart", to a God who is "merciful, slow to anger and abounding in love." Ash Wednesday is the prelude to the forty days of Lent. It reminds us of the time Jesus spent in the wilderness before he began his public ministry. The first three Sundays of Lent focus on repentance, forgiveness and a new start with God. Midway through this season comes Mothering Sunday with thanksgiving for Mother Church and our own mothers. From the fifth Sunday in Lent onwards, we look towards the suffering and death of Christ, known as the Passion. Lent ends on Maundy Thursday afternoon, leaving us ready for the great events of Maundy Thursday evening, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Day. I encourage you to engage with the spirit of Lent, to take time to be with God and maybe join us for our Lent course – please let me know if you are coming (details below).

Next Sunday (26th Feb), our evening worship at 5pm at Napton will be a special Taizé service. The Taizé community is an ecumenical monastic brotherhood in France. Their worship is based on the repetitive singing of chants, usually focussing on a simple phrase from Scripture that helps create a prayerful meditative experience.
