At our final Lent course this week on "holy habits" we looked at how Jesus continued to be generous to others while under tremendous pressure himself as he approached Jerusalem and the cross: how he washed his disciples feet; didn't publically denounce Judas by name; continued to praise God; didn't condemn the disciples for falling asleep when he asked them to keep watch; healed the ear of the high priest's servant; comforted the women along the way to Golgotha; promised a place in heaven for the thief beside him on the cross; forgave those who executed him and commended his mother Mary and friend John to each other as he died.

The commentary for the session said that "Someone once described love as grace under pressure. On several occasions in the Holy Week narratives, we see this grace at work in Jesus. One of the hallmarks of those who are devoted followers of Jesus is the way they are generous towards others, even when they are under the most intense pressure or experiencing the most severe suffering." Something to ponder.
