### **Rectory reflection from Rev Andy**

At the latest Collective meeting we were thinking about the theme of life and death, and that is very appropriate for this Easter season as we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus, and the defeat of sin, evil and death. I wonder what you think about heaven, the fulfilment of Gods great plan to restore all of his creation? I am not talking about an ethereal existence, filled with angels and music and light, which many people seem to believe, some sort of alternative dimension where their loved ones can keep an eye on what is going on down here. No, scripture seems to make it clear that the life to come will be very much a physical existence, just without the things that have darkened and damaged Gods once perfect creation. Jesus resurrected body was clearly physical, he could eat, be touched, recognised, even if he gained some abilities that human beings don't possess yet. Paul writes that 'We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump'. That leads us to some fascinating reflections. What will our purpose be in this restored creation? Will the things we love in this life continue? What about the animals that can become as dear as family to us? There is still much mystery about what eternal life will be like, but we can be sure that it will, as I often say at funerals, make our present life seem like a pale shadow of that new and perfect existence. I hope that thrills you as much as it does me!

Dear Lord, on this glorious Easter morning, we rejoice in the resurrection of your Son, Jesus Christ. Thank you for the hope and new life that Easter brings. May we live in the light of His victory over death.
