News from Napton

Greetings from St Lawrence Napton!

At our recent home group, we finished our most recent study, this time on Luke, and in the process we remembered (and prayed for) an old friend, Dick Harrison, who died last year. His wisdom on Greek translation and the knowledge of the bible was extensive, and a lot of fun for those of us with limited experience in the background of new testament texts.

In St Lawrence School, the exploration of Genesis and the creation story in Job, was the topic of work. This is in Year 4, ages 8-9! I was staggered that such young children were asked to study this but they did so with relish. The pictures were delightful and their own 'creations' (football world...who'd have thought!) showed a real sense of understanding how hard it might have been - when do you stop creating, when is it finished?

Getting together *to discuss* the bible and share your own reflections is so important to our spiritual health. Luke 24 v27 says '.. Jesus took them through the writings of Moses and all the prophets, explaining from all the Scriptures the things concerning himself.' Jesus called his followers foolish when they hadn't connected his suffering, death and resurrection with the old testament predictions. Rectory reflection from Rev Andy

Our gospel reading for this Sunday has Jesus facing opposition from both his family and the religious authorities. They both accuse him of being a tool of Satan himself, who is providing him with the means to perform exorcisms and miracles. The phrase 'out of his mind' used by Jesus family in this context is often used to describe someone who is demon possessed. However Jesus is completely unlike any of the magicians and exorcists of his day, he does not use spells, incantations, or physical manipulations. He offers a simple word of powerful rebuke on his own authority. The scribes have not accused Jesus to his face, but behind his back, so Jesus 'calls them to him' in order to confront them; he wants the accusation to be addressed, and to rebuke them. In his parable Jesus explains that the only person who can bind a strong man is someone who is stronger, and Jesus is here claiming greater power than the power of Satan. This is no 'gentle Jesus, meek and mild'! Jesus is telling us that there is a real spiritual battle, and he engages in it with overwhelming power against the forces of darkness to bring peace and liberty to those he delivers. Marks gospel often portrays Jesus' ministry as engaged in a cosmic conflict, and offers a valuable contrast to the more usual images of gentle healer and teacher. The Markan Jesus teaches with unprecedented authority, he forgives people their sins with seemingly divine authority, he has the supernatural ability to tame nature, he has the power to heal and even overcome death, and he has complete authority over unclean spirits.

Prayer

Lord Jesus, we cry out for an encounter with You. Perhaps some tangible experience in which we would sense Your nearness or witness a miracle. But sometimes that powerful encounter occurs within us. We pray that you would continue to transform our hearts and lives that we may be your witnesses in a challenging world, and continue your work of opposing evil and healing lives.
